DESIGN AND PARTICIPANTS

- Prison sites across Midwest and Eastern U.S.
- Questionnaires pre- and post-workshop
- Inmates: N=254 (192 male, 54 female)
 - 39 Hispanic, 129 African-American (many not reported)
 - Mean age: 33.7 ± 10.1
- Staff members: N=28 (17 male, 5 female)
 - 19 Hispanic, 6 African-American
 - Mean age: 43.2 ± 6.9

- CES-D-10
 - 10-item version of the Center for Epidemiological Studies Depression scale (Radloff, 1977)
 - Higher score = more depressed ⊗

LOT-R

- Life Orientation Test-Revised (Scheier et al., 1994)
- Higher score = more optimism ☺

STAI

- State-Trait Anxiety Inventory (Spielberger et al., 1970)
- Higher score = more anxiety ☺






STAI
